HIGH GAS UTILITY BILLS



- A new article from Utilities Director Dean Batchelor answers four critical community questions on the recent spike in gas utility bills.
 - If you need help with your bill, please contact Utilities Customer service at (650) 329-2161.
- Of note, we've heard concern that the General Fund is receiving a windfall from these high costs. This is not the case, though more work is needed to confirm.
- There are two ways that gas revenues benefit the City's General Fund: an annual transfer (recently affirmed through 2022 Measure L) and a Utility Users Tax (UUT).
 - Staff is analyzing the effect of the current spike on likely future transfers, and developing a recommendation to be reviewed in March by the Utility Advisory Commission, City Council Finance Committee
 - Staff is also analyzing the likely effect on the UUT and City budget. This effect is uncertain, given unanticipated high utility costs at all City-operated facilities.
