STORM UPDATE


- Per National Weather Service, severe weather continues this week.
- Expect heavy rain, possible thunderstorms and a flood watch and high wind warning in effect through Wednesday.
- Remain alert and aware of the weather forecasts, as conditions can change rapidly.
- Prepare for possible community impacts such as water ponding on roadways and road closures, and power outages due to down trees, water, or wind impacts.
- Staff continue to monitor creek levels and are ready to respond to issue that arise.

 - **March 26:** Women in STEM Panel


